## Ministry To the Homeless in Longmont

Front Range Christian Fellowship is a church that cares about the people of its community. Three years ago we opened our doors to bring in the homeless community on those nights when the weather was below 20 degrees. This service of love and concern has spread throughout Longmont to include many fellow Christians, and two other churches have also opened their doors to the homeless in Longmont. We provide emergency shelter on the winter nights when the temperature is too cold for any human to be outside. We also provide a place for those less fortunate, to find love and friendship and hear the word of God whenever the opportunity arises. This is a safe place where they are fed physically and spiritually. My husband Lyle and I are the coordinators for this ministry at Front Range Christian Fellowship. We help those in need and minister to those who want and need God's love. In return they give us their appreciation and express concern for our lives as well.



Many guests come in after a long day of wandering the streets of Longmont. We have no idea what they have been through or what they have seen during the day. Many come in after drinking. For lack of anything better to do, they tell us about their experiences. We accept them and are there to listen, in case they need someone to talk to. Many just sit and chat while they eat their cup of soup or sandwich. Some are just tired

and want to go to sleep immediately and are very thankful to have a warm soft place to lay their heads. They don't have to fear that someone will take their only belongings while they are in our care. They often leave with more than they came with. People have brought hats, gloves, socks, thermal underwear, boots, and coats for us to share with our guests in case they are without any of these essentials. God's love is all over Longmont.

A few of these guests have come to the Lord and were baptized. How exciting to see their lives turned around. A few have conquered their addictions and returned to a life full of promise. As a result of God's love shown by all the volunteers, some have left the streets and are now volunteering at the emergency shelter, giving back what they were given when they were in need – God's Love! It is wonderful to see God at work in our lives. God is so good if we just let Him have control of our lives. We are highly blessed and thankful for this ministry opportunity.
